New Jersey: Personally appeared in open Court before
the Justices of the Supreme & Council of Judicature of
New Jersey John Lansing, who being duly
sworn doth say that he is now in his seventieth
year, that he was born & brought up in the town-
ship of Trenton now being, Hunterdon then
New Jersey that at the time the American War began
his Father lived near to the above named
William Green; that his Father & William Green
went out as Volunteers in the militia together,
that on one occasion when he was in his ninth
year in 1776. while they were both out on duty
his Mother moved in with Mr. Green
while their own husbands were absent. that
William Green was frequently out on duty
of the militia and in duty during the war,
that he afterwards in course of the war became
an Sergeant and Lieutenant. that he present
was well acquainted with him & his family,
that they were highly respected in the neighbor-
hood, and raised a large family of children.
of whom two Sons and two Daughters are still
living in the same neighborhood. The Sons and
his Widow Charles Green live upon them.

some place where the said William Green
always resided and lived at the time of his
death - That the said Phile Green still re-
mains his widow. That he has fre-
quently heard his father and the said William
Green and other old Revolutionary soldiers
talk over the events of the war, and the
different towns they both served, that he
well remembers seeing and frequently of-
sitting them in their uniforms and
accoutrements when getting ready to
go out on duty. That they were in
the habit of taking a supply of provisions
at different times - That he remembers
the Regt. Horse of Washington, being
billeted at different times during the war
at William Green's plantation. That he
died about twenty or twenty one years ago
