After a period of study and review, TCNJ has decided to use the farmhouse as an Alumni House, working toward full restoration efforts beginning September 2012. A clear function for the house is a critical step in obtaining grants and funding for a full restoration of the house.

The farmhouse will incorporate a museum function, using photographs or historical material throughout the house documenting its rich architectural and community history. TCNJ plans to obtain a cost estimate for a full restoration by September and move forward with grants and fund-raising.

Your personal support is vital, so we will have funds to use in developing a phased restoration plan and fund-raising campaign, and in having matching funds available for grants.
